On 22 October 2018, H.E. Prof. Muliaman Hadad, Ph.D., Ambassador of the Embassy of The Republic of Indonesia to Switzerland and Liechtenstein, will hold an early evening lecture on "Global financial reform and crisis management protocols: Indonesia's Experience". Professor Peter Van den Bossche, Director of Studies at the World Trade Institute, will open the lecture. Biography of the Speaker

Dr. Hadad was the Chairman of the Indonesia Financial Services Authority (FSA) during the period of July 2012 - July 2017. Prior to his position in Indonesia FSA, he served as one of the Deputy Governors of Bank Indonesia (Central Bank of Indonesia), a position he assumed since December 2006.

During his period of service at Bank Indonesia, Dr. Hadad held various positions; among them were Head of Financial System Stability Bureau and Director of Banking Research and Regulation. His career at Bank Indonesia spanned a period of 25 years.

Dr. Hadad also serves as the Chair of the Indonesia Sharia Economic Community (since

2011), Indonesia Economist Association (since 2015), and teaches at several universities in Jakarta, Indonesia. He writes numerous books and journals—some of which were published overseas—and spoke at numerous international fora on the subject of financial system regulations and stability.

Dr. Hadad holds a Bachelor Degree in Economics from University of Indonesia (Universitas Indonesia/UI) and a Master of Public Administration from John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, USA. He earned his Doctorate Degree in Business and Economics from Monash University, Melbourne, Australia, in 1996.
