They have the cumulative expertise, international perspectives and geographic reach to significantly advance research and teaching on EU trade policy and promote wider understanding of the process of globalisation and the role of the services sectors in our economies at a global level.

TIISA Activities

The network will take a deliberately cross-disciplinary approach to activities, spanning economics, statistics, law and business innovation, to enable coverage of the various modes of international delivery of services and to allow proper coverage of a wide variety of regulatory issues across the globe. The flagship events will be the TIISA annual conferences held at WTI Bern on 20-21 September 2019 on Trade in Services by Mode of Supply, at UIBE Beijing in 2020 on Servicification, Services and Productivity, and at Örebro University in 2021 on Services and Digitization. Additionally, the network will hold workshops (the first at the Chinese University of Hong Kong on 16-17 August 2019 on Trade in Services and Investment in a Climate of Trade Protectionism), promote staff mobility and visiting seminars, and hold an annual PhD conference (the first in Bern on 19 September 2019).
