The researcher will join a team and conduct research on the governance systems that have been created to monitor and improve labor standards in global supply chains.

The researcher will be expected to undertake the following activities:

- Conduct academic research under the direction of Dr. Damian Raess and under guidance of, and in collaboration with the Pls, Dr. Raess and Prof. Matthew Amengual, as well as in collaboration with other team members
- Contribute to the preparation and analysis of data, including choice and implementation of identification strategies
- Contribute to research that will be published in academic journals

- Hold a Master or Doctoral degree in Social Sciences (Economics, Political Science, Sociology, or related fields)
- Competence in quantitative methods in the social sciences, including knowledge of statistical software (Stata and/or R)
- Ability to contribute to research that will be published in leading social science journals
- Fluency in English

- Knowledge of core econometrics techniques, in particular instrumental variables and differences-indifferences methods
- Knowledge of the Orbis dataset and fuzzy matching
