BREAKING NEW GROUND: AN INTRODUCTION TO THE WTO AGREEMENT ON FACILITATION AND ITS IMPLEMENTATION

Background

As tariffs have continued to drop around the globe, attention shifted to the remaining trade barriers on the non-tariff side. Trade facilitation emerged as an increasingly high priority for business and policymakers alike. Seeking to expedite the movement of goods and to cut back on hampering red tape, facilitation reforms have become a key component of international trade policies. In times of globalized manufacturing and just-in-time delivery, they are crucial for improving the competitiveness of enterprises and for successfully integrating production into cross-border value chains.

Global efforts to advance trade facilitation gained momentum when the WTO launched negotiations on a new Agreement in 2004. They were brought to a successful conclusion at the WTO's Ninth Ministerial Conference in December of 2013. Following a subsequent ratification process, the Trade Facilitation Agreement entered into force in February 2017. While its full potential has yet to be reached, the Agreement already left a significant mark and lifted facilitation reforms to a new level. Its innovative approach to implementation set a new reference point for future multilateral trade agreements.
