



UNITAR/WTI Online Course on Trade, Energy and Climate Change

(16 APRIL - 18 MAY 2012)

Overview: Climate change is among the most important international issues facing the world today. This course, which is jointly conducted with the World Trade Institute (University of Bern, Switzerland) will give you an inside look at recent developments in the WTO to address the triangle of trade, energy and climate change, including the WTO-legality of carbon taxes, emissions trading, and border measures. Particular attention will be devoted to developing country and emerging economies concerns.

Target Audience: Private sector professionals, diplomats, civil servants, NGO staff, and media representatives will benefit most from taking this course.

Certification: A Certificate of Completion will be issued jointly by UNITAR and WTI to all participants who successfully complete the course-related assignments.

- Is climate change a developed or developing world problem?
- To what extent, if any, is trade linked to climate change and, if so, can the trading system be harnessed to reduce climate change?
- What role should the World Trade Organization (WTO) play in the effort to mitigate climate change?
- What are the implications of unilateral climate change policies in the energy sector for international trade?
