




Sustainability vs Trade Issues



The "export bias" of WTO/ASCM leaves national regulators free to "ecodump" (= allocate water below the market price to cash crops and other exports)





WTO rules for workers' protection?

The ILO DG was <u>disinvited</u> from the WTO Ministerial in Singapore (1996).

- General, stringent and <u>enforceable</u> nondiscrimination rules
- No WTO rules specifically address the issue of labour standards or Social Dumping
- TBT and SPS Agreements have <u>implementation</u> standards
 - e.g. US + BRA Factory inspection resources
 - a basis for "social antidumping"?

No PIL – even *ius cogens* – ever trumped WTO Law.

Obesity and Trade

- Freer trade makes more and cheaper food available, but also safe but unhealthy «junk» food.
- ➤ Obesity, malnutrition and overweight as a globally bigger problem than hunger and with a BIG trade impact. Why?
- ➤ Policy space allows for surplus disposal by rich countries (e.g. turkey tails and mutton flaps in Samoa).
- Health policies can prevent <u>and</u> promote trade. How?

Animal welfare vs Traditional way of life vs Economics? What about International Standards?



Sustainability concern: 'Animal welfare'



- A (hot) issue of differences in standards – and some regulations.
- The standards (in Europe) are imposed by society. Are they?
- Differences of this kind imply higher production costs.
- Animal welfare under WTO rules are (only) an issue of competition and market access.

Public Morals (Foster 2019)

- ➤ "Public morals defences entered international economic law at a time predating the current highly legalized dispute settlement processes with which we are now familiar, and that they are unsuited by nature to international adjudication in its present form."
- Legitimate public policy objectives featuring in certain recently negotiated regional free trade agreements poses fewer concerns of this nature."
